**1. God Is In Control | v21-22**

- Nothing can come against God’s set purpose and plan.

**2. God Is Faithful To His People | v23**

- God has told us what he will do in the Future.
- Why does God choose Zerubbabel?
- My Servant - 1 Peter 5:6-7, Matt 23:11
- What is a Signet Ring?
- I have chosen you - James 4:8
- Matt 1:13 – The line of David will continue on to the Birth of Jesus Christ, the promised Messiah.
- God keeps His Promises. God is on our Side. Are we on His side? 2Cor 1:20; 2Peter 1:3

**3. God Is Calling Us To Be His Signet Ring**

- Main Point: God has chosen us to be his signet ring, his seal of authority and ownership, in a world that is shaken by chaos and conflict.
- Hebrews 12:38
  - “The significance of a signet ring in Haggai 2 is that it represents God’s choice, favor, and authority over Zerubbabel, the governor of Judah and a descendant of David. A signet ring was a ring that had a unique emblem or seal engraved on it, and was used by ancient kings and rulers to authenticate their documents and orders. A signet ring was a symbol of honor, trust, and power.”
- Represent God to the world by living a holy and godly life, by loving and serving others, by sharing and showing the gospel, and by being a peacemaker and a justice-seeker. Use your gifts and talents to honor him and bless others. Be his signet ring, his seal of authority and ownership, on his hand.

**Questions for Personal and Group Study**

- 2) How does Haggai show God’s sovereign plan in his sermons in the book?

- 5) Why does God choose Zerubbabel as his Signet Ring or “My servant” at this time in History?
- 6) How does being a servant of God open greater opportunities for God’s glory?
- 7) In light of all the chaos and conflict in the world; in what ways does God want us to live? Reflect on the paragraphs in the notes and the main point.
